Associate Degree Program

The Associate Degree program is a foundational degree consisting of 60-64 credits, typically completed over a 2-year period. The program provides a comprehensive learning experience that also allows students to customize and focus their coursework in an area of personal interest.

On completion of an Associate Degree program, students may choose to either enter the workforce or continue their studies in pursuit of a Bachelor's Degree. International students completing an Associate Degree program may be eligible to apply for a Post-Graduation Work Permit (visit www.cic.gc.ca for details).

- Canadian Citizenship or legal authorization to study in Canada (e.g. permanent residency or study permit)
- Minimum age of 16 years, as of the first day of classes
